CAR SHOW EDITORIAL

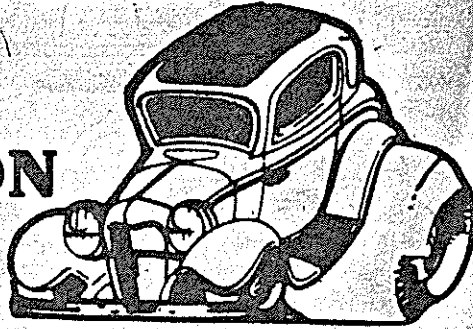
