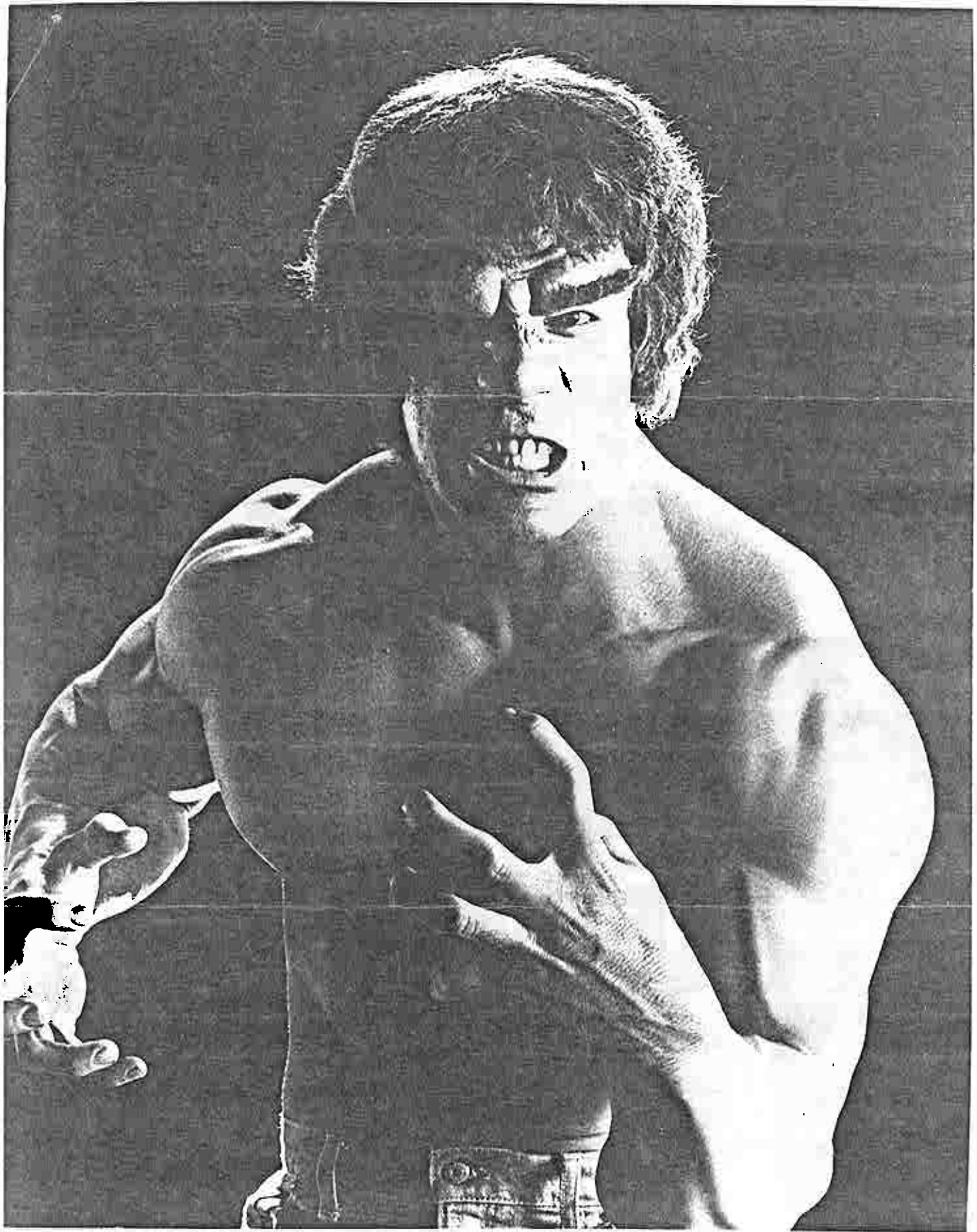

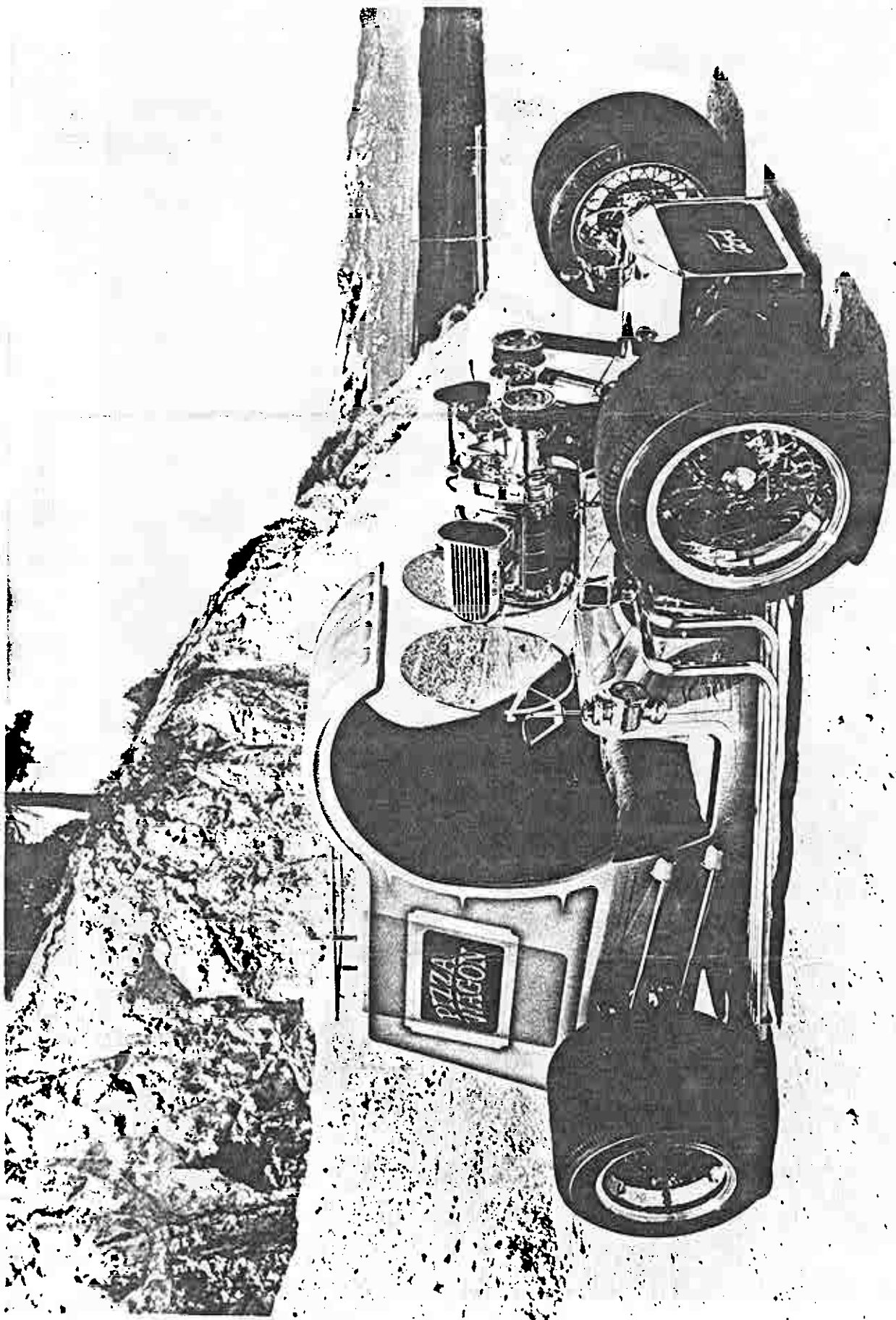

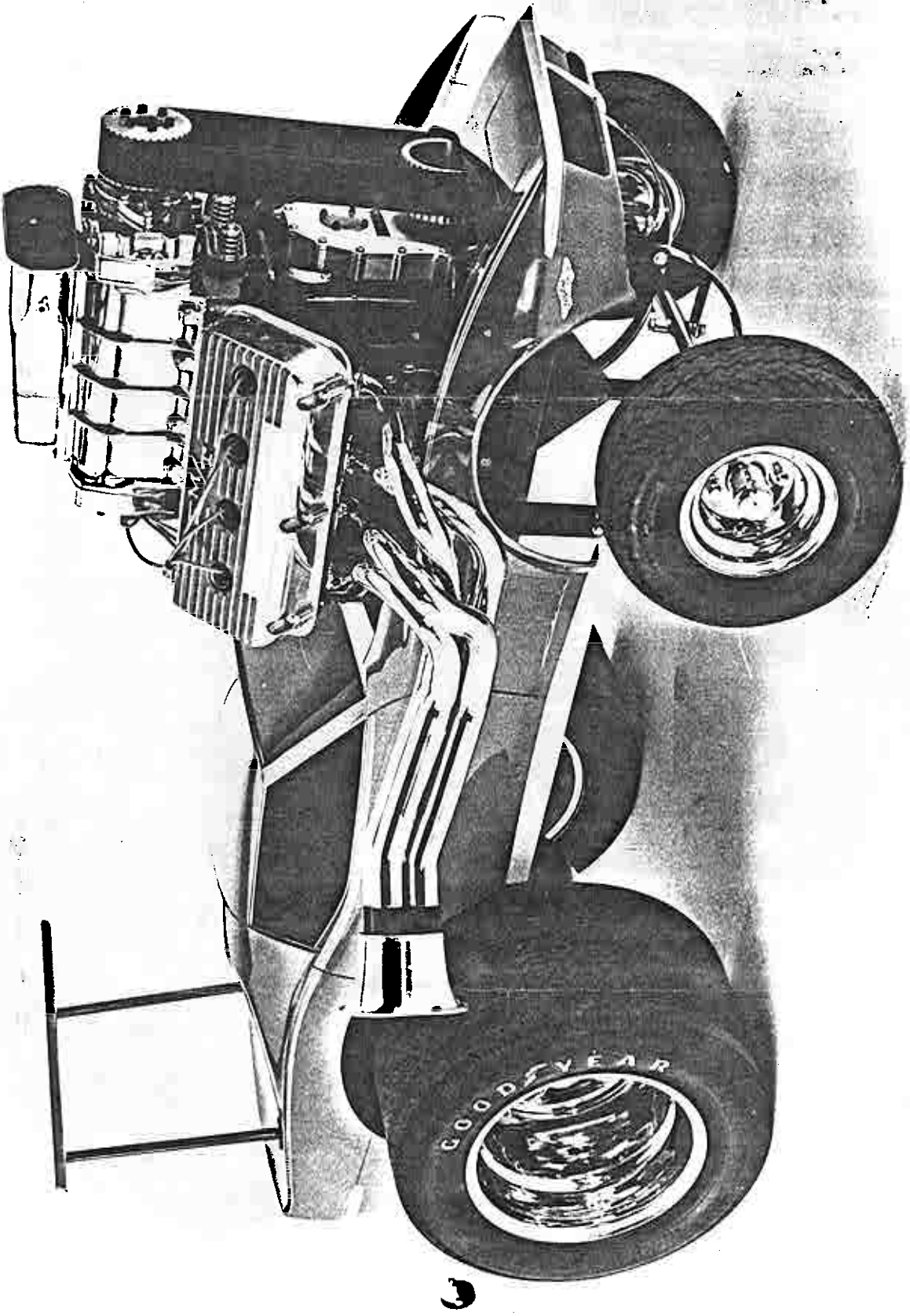
## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - FEBRUARY 1984

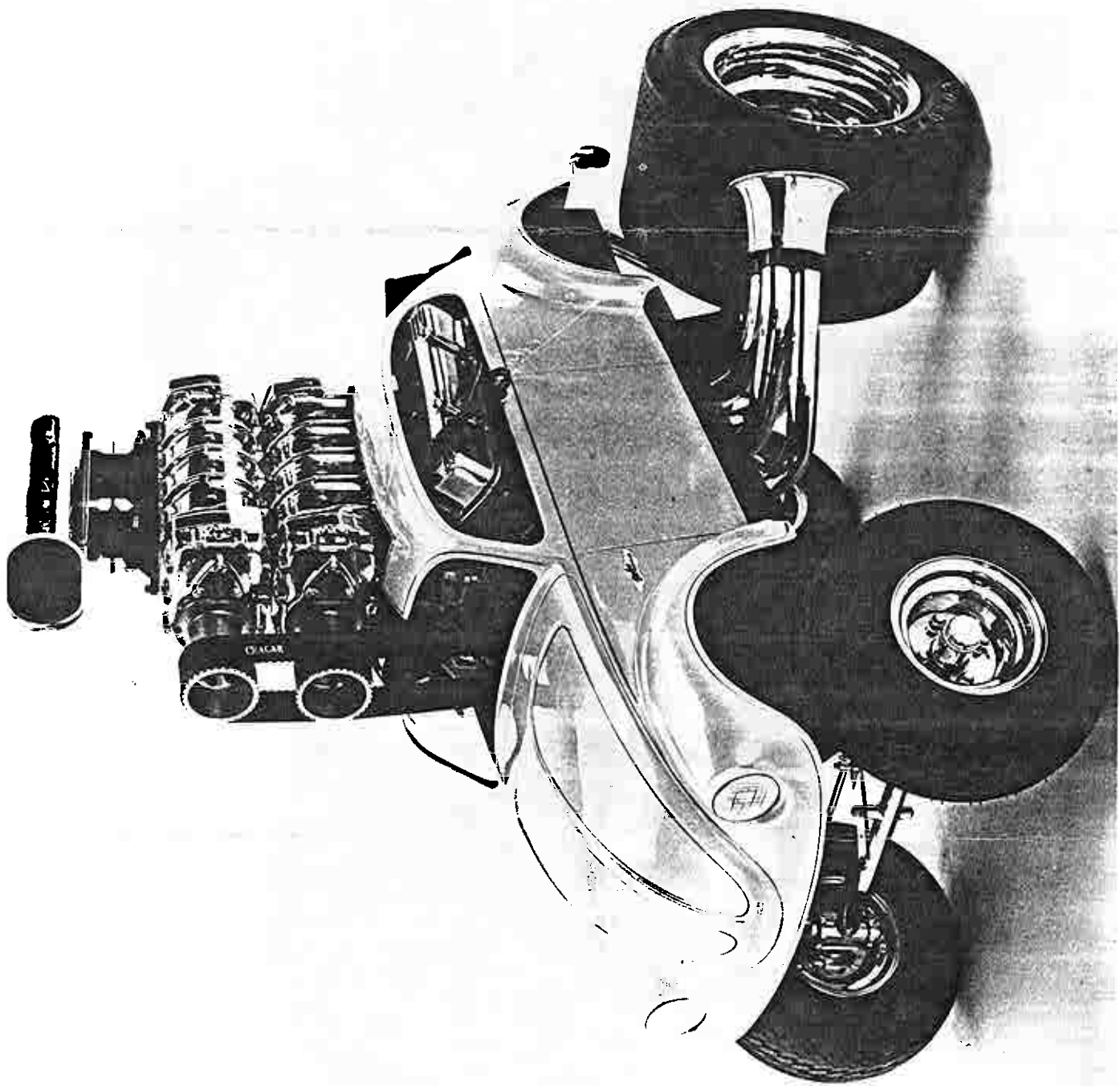

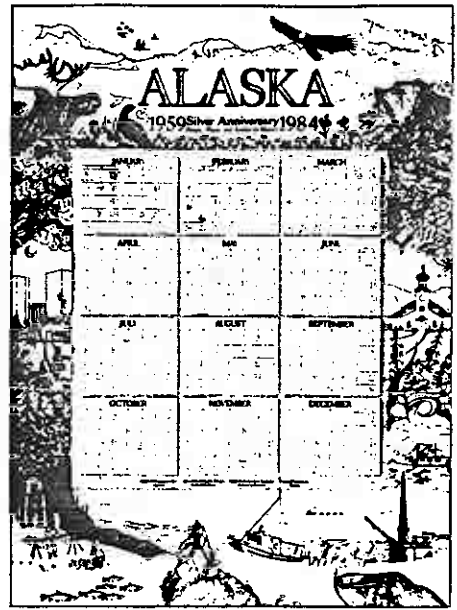
